St. Peter's celebrates 49 years of camp service weekends

St. Peter's completed our 49th camp service weekend at Camp Chrysalis with 35 attending. There was work for everyone including the little ones. The jobs completed were mixing and pouring a 14x4 handicap ramp to the mess hall, preparing youth leaders cabin with painting, plumbing, wall construction, bath tub enclosure, wiring and installing vent fan and outside flood light. Other outside work included planting flower beds and mulching. Laid edging bricks along walkway to mess hall mortared in 3 layers high. Mark your calendar for next years as St. Peter's celebrates its 50th camp service weekend at Lutherhill in La Grange.

Delegates Report on the Synod Assembly

Sandy and Sherry Sanders, delegates for St. Peter's, attended the Southwestern Texas Synod Assembly held in San Antonio May 5-7. The theme was getting back to our roots as the Lutheran church in Texas, with languages of English, German, and Spanish being spoken during worship services. A good old-fashioned gospel worship service opened the event on Friday night. During the worship service on Saturday, music was led by a polka band and we sang hymns and liturgy to the tunes of polka songs. The Lutheran church in Shiner opened the service with a musical presentation by their youth and children, which was fantastic and moving.

There were two resolutions brought to the floor during the plenary sessions, both involving immigrants and their care. The first one encouraging the synod to implement Accompanying Migrant Minors

with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities, (AMMPRO). The second resolution encouraging congregations and individuals to welcome refugees. Both resolutions passed with over 80% approval.

Two new congregations were welcomed to the Southwestern Texas Synod, New Life, in Dripping Springs, and Grace, in Giddings.

We were informed of the recent changes in rostered ministers. There are two groups: Ministers of Word and Sacrament, who serve congregations as pastors, and Ministers of Word and Services, who are designated as deacons and serve in many other positions.

The remainder of the plenary

From the transitional minister

In the Lutheran Church, Confirmation is not a sacrament.

At the time of the Reformation, Martin Luther studied Scripture and decided that the marks of a sacrament were: 1. A sacrament must be instituted by Jesus. And 2. A sacrament must have a physical element accompanied by the Word. So in the Lutheran Church only Baptism (water and the Word) and The Lord's Supper (Bread and wine with the Word) qualify as sacraments.

Confession, which is a sacrament in the Roman Catholic Church was personally so meaningful to Luther that he wanted to include it as a sacrament, but finally Luther could not find a physical element that would qualify Confession as a sacrament.

On June 4th we will baptize HARPER MAY, the infant daughter of Colby and Regina May (Granddaughter of Laura Sue and Don Rogers). We all want the best for Harper, and we baptize her knowing that she is a child of God. She belongs to God. Harper's parents and sponsors will promise to bring her to worship services and teach her the ten commandments, the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. That same day three of our youth who were baptized as infants: Payge Brown, Ryan Klinkerman and Fischer Saxton will affirm their baptism faith. And we will confirm their membership in St. Peter Lutheran by the laying on of hands.

The Baptist Churches and other denominations that do not baptize infants emphasize that the will and faith of the believer must be present for true baptism to take place. Most main line churches do baptize infants. We stress that God acts in Baptism. God accepts the baptized person so that all the promises God makes in the Scripture apply to infants when they become a child of God at their baptism. We who baptize infants know that it is important for a baptized person

to take their faith seriously. So when the child, baptized as an infant, is old enough to understand the importance of Christian faith, we provide special instruction and at the end of the training period, we do not baptize the child a second time. Instead we allow the youth to affirm their baptism. In effect the youth says: "My parents and sponsors wanted the best for me as a child, so they had me baptized. Now, that I am old enough to understand the promises of God and the meaning of the faith into which I was baptized, I want to affirm my faith. The Church will confirm my faith by the laying on of hands. And my congregation will accept me as a full member of the Body of Christ."

Call Committee Report

The call committee has entered into the interviewing process. Currently we are preparing for two interviews — one face to face interview and one phone interview. As mentioned in previous reports, much information has to remain highly confidential at this time, but we encourage members to help us identify questions that could be used during the interview process. What items would you like us to address? How can we ensure that your voice is represented during the interviews? Your input is key to our success and we welcome you to share any ideas that you may have. We thank those of you who have already shared some ideas.

As always, please remain persistent in prayer — God, keep us mindful of your presence among us as we seek to discern your will for us. We pray that you will help us see beyond our own needs to the needs of your Church. We pray that you will open our eyes to new possibilities and opportunities of being your people. Guide us and lead us, O Lord. Amen.

Council calls congregational meeting

At the regular May council meeting, Gerald Griffith presented updates on the columbarium and a bid for the related concrete work. Council then set a called congregational meeting, to be held immediately following the 9a.m. worship service on June 11, to present the columbarium information along with the concrete bid to the congregation. Notice of the called congregational meeting, along with a survey regarding traditional burial and the disposition of cremated remains, will be mailed to all members. Members are asked to complete the survey and return it to the church office or a council member prior to the meeting.

Christian Education and Youth Ministry chair, Eva Nell Griffith, reported that St. Peter's has a credit with Augsburg due to the Spark Book Fair, which can be used for Bibles or other items needed by youth or Sunday School. She noted that, on May 7 following worship, a graduation reception was held, and on May 21 and May 28, the summer Blessing of Wheeled Things will be done during the services. Bible School will be held June 16 and 17, with the closing on June 18 during worship service.

Eva Nell then reported, as a member of the Worship and Music committee, that a special thank you is given to Marilyn Morris for cleaning and ironing the acolyte robes. She stated that going forward, it will be the responsibility of the parents of the acolytes to make certain that the robes are cleaned and taken care of as needed.

Billy Dornburg, chair of Outreach, reported on the worship service at La Bahia Nursing Home on May 14. He stated that only a few members were present and no musician was available. It was suggested that a list of alternative musicians from the community be available if a musician from the church is not able to attend the service.

Kenneth Brand, Church Property chair, reported on cost of projects and supplies including air conditioning repair and maintenance, bids for painting at the picnic area, parking lot, and purchase of bath tissue and towels. He stated he will continue to work on these property needs.

In reviewing the treasurer's report, David Bowman, chair of Finance and Stewardship, noted the large amount in St. Peter's Ministry Fund for April, due to some large special gifts. He noted that members' giving is staying stable during this time of transition, and gives thanks to all members for their contributions. It was noted that St. Peter's continues to look for a volunteer to help in the church office.

St Peter's Women of the ELCA completed the in-kind gifts that will be sent to the tenth Triennial Gathering, on July 13-16, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Sandra Post displayed the Mother's Day and Father's Day gifts, and dates for summer Lutheran World Relief workdays were set.

Bible study was led by Marilyn Morris from the May *Gather* magazine entitled "You Are Not Alone,"—Ten reflections from 10 women sharing what it means to trust God.

Deanna Wacker presented "Points to Ponder" with a reading entitled "The Power of Our Words," with a Bible passage from Ephesians 4:29. The words that we speak have the power to do great good or great harm. God intends that we speak words of kindness, wisdom, and truth, no matter our circumstances, no matter our emotions.

Dorothy Bowman, president, called the May 9 meeting to order with ten members present. The May 14 Mother's Day recognition and collection of the monetary gifts for Upbring was discussed. Report on St. Peter's May 7 recognition of the 2017 graduate and 8th grade graduates was given. Rachel's Day, recognized during the worship service on May 7, was reported on.

Four members delivered the 2016/2017 Lutheran World Relief quilts and kits, on April 19, to Texas Lutheran University in Seguin. Linda Dornburg received approval of the \$250 Thrivent Action Team grant to help pay for the quilt batting that will be ordered for making the LWR quilts during 2017/2018. Dorothy Bowman will apply for \$250 from Thrivent for "Kits for Kids" to help pay for cloth diapers.

We were reminded that we will not hold

June and July meetings, with the monthly meeting resuming in August. Summer LWR quilting workdays, beginning at 9a.m., were scheduled for May 17, June 21, and July 19.

Dorothy discussed the funds, that are available from St. Peter's Women of the ELCA for the college students, with Rhonda Irwin, College Connection Ministry Leader. Rhonda will notified us if funds are needed.

Offerings were then given and the meeting closed with Dorothy leading the prayer.

St. Peter's Women of the ELCA will hold their next regular meeting at 3 p.m. on August 8. Bible study will be held prior to the meeting at 2 p.m.

sessions were mostly informational, presenting the many and varied resources the synod offers congregations and individuals to help and encourage them to continue their ministries, including Young Adults in Global Mission, (YAGM). We heard a detailed report of one young man's experiences in Mexico, while living with a local family and ministering to the community, as well as learning from the native people.

A new endowment fund, The Tiemann Endowment Fund, was created in honor of Bishop Tiemann and his wife, for 18 years of service. The Lutheran Foundation of the Southwest will oversee the fund that will be utilized to support leadership within congregations. The first disbursement of funds will be awarded in December 2018.

By the end of the assembly, the offering totaled \$58,032, with \$14,927 given by the Bluebonnet Conference, which surpassed our goal of \$2,000.

The whole weekend was very motivational and informational and we thank you for sending us.

Mission Endowment Fund gifts shared

St. Peter's celebrated the third-annual distribution from the St. Peter's Lutheran Church of Ander Mission Endowment Fund as part of the May 14 worship service. Established in 2008, the purpose of the mission endowment fund is to fund mission work at home and around the world, above and beyond the programs supported through regular offerings.

The mission endowment fund is managed for the congregation by the ELCA Foundation in the ELCA Endowment Fund Pooled Trust—Fund A. The value of fund as of December 31, 2016 is \$40,686.83.
