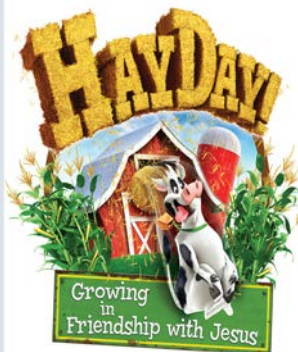


St. Peter's celebrates 50th Camp Service Weekend at Lutherhill in LaGrange

Missionary to preside at St. Peter's June 24 communion service

St. Peter's will welcome ELCA missionary, the Rev. Dr. Carolyn Schneider, for a visit with the congregation on Sunday, June 24.

Pastor Schneider, who has been teaching at the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Hong Kong, will preside at the 9a.m. service. A brunch will be held in the parish hall, following the worship service.

For the last 3½ years St. Peter's has been providing financial support for Pastor Schneider's ministry as a missionary, in addition to ELCA mission support. Valerie Albrecht, global mission advocate, has been assisting the congregation in staying connected with Pastor Schneider throughout the year, and we have received regular letters from Hong Kong through the years.

She has finished her missionary work now, and will soon be going to Mexico City as a student.



Mission Endowment Fund gifts shared

Distribution of the fourth-annual St. Peter's Lutheran Church of Ander Mission Endowment Fund has been completed. Established in 2008, the purpose of the mission endowment fund is to fund mission work at home and around the world, above and beyond the programs supported through regular offerings.

The mission endowment fund is managed for the congregation by the ELCA Foundation in the ELCA Endowment Fund Pooled Trust—Fund A. The value of the fund as of December 31, 2017 is \$51,793.15.

Report on the Synod Assembly and election of Bishop Sue Briner

Eva Nell and Gerald Griffith, along with Pastor Anne, attended the annual assembly of our Southwestern Texas Synod May 4-6 in San Marcos. Worship and prayer were the centerpieces of the assembly as we made decisions and elected people to serve on synod council, chair action teams, and attend the 2019 Churchwide Assembly. Highlights of the assembly:

- Pr. Sue Briner was elected to serve as the synod's next Bishop. She will be installed into office on Sept. 1 at 2p.m. at University United Methodist Church in San Antonio.
- Prayer shawls used for the bishop's election (more than 400 of them!) were made by volunteers across the synod,

and voting members "wrapped themselves in prayer" as they voted.

- San Pablo Lutheran Church, San Antonio, was accepted as a new congregation in the synod.
- Enjoyed a farewell banquet for Bishop Ray and Debbie Tiemann on Saturday evening. The assembly celebrated the gifts received for the Tiemann Endowment Fund for Leadership Development - \$57,170 so far. St. Peter's contribution was \$500 into this fund. Gifts are always welcome, and the 2019 assembly offering has been designated for the Tiemann Endowment.

- Received an assembly offering for the synod's account in Fund for Leaders (supporting seminary scholarships) of \$69,255.23. St. Peter's contributed \$1,100 into this fund. Gifts will continue to be received through August 31. Please mark gifts as "Synod Assembly Offering."
- Announced the 2019 Synod Assembly to be held on May 31-June 2 at the Bayfront Omni Hotel in Corpus Christi.





PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

"Shawls ... made for centuries universal and embracing, symbolic of an inclusive, unconditionally loving, God. They wrap, enfold, comfort, cover, give solace, hug, shelter and beautify. Those who have received these shawls have been uplifted and affirmed....." From shawlministry.com.

As the 2018 synod assembly approached, knitters and crocheters synod wide made prayer shawls - one for each voting member to wear through the election/call process for our new bishop. These shawls were made with prayers for the receivers, and meant a lot to those who received them. We here at St. Peter's would like to continue this shawl ministry so that we have shawls for Pastor to give to those who are sick, shut in, grieving, and other times when they may be in need of reminders of God's love and that they are surrounded with and "wrapped in" our prayers.

If you knit or crochet, consider making these shawls for this ministry - just give them to Pastor Anne when you're done! You can use any stitch/design you wish (20"x80" rectangle is most practical as it can be used as a lap robe as well), and any color. Soft yarn (such as HomeSpun) is best, but any kind of yarn can be used. If you would be willing to teach someone else how to knit or crochet, let Kathy Albrecht know, and she can hook you up with someone who wants to learn.
